



John McKenzie has made and flown several of these Volunteer kites with great success! They are quite different in construction that American fighter kites. And also have different flight characteristics.....it 's a very interesting kite. One that John likes very much!

The main and most obvious difference in the construction of the kite is that it uses 2 bows; one on the back side and one on the front side of the spine.

The bows are secured together by the upper bridle lines at the upper bridle points. They are glued together with CA glue from the upper bridle points to the wingtips.

I have flown this kite and also flown against it in line touch competitions, it is unorthodox in its flight characteristics which makes it difficult to defend against in a line touch point.

It has very little pull on the flying line, even when flown in strong winds.
